Protecting Breastfeeding: A shared responsibility

Information for entrants

To celebrate World Breastfeeding Week 2021, the Central Coast Local Health District (CCLHD) Breastfeeding and Infant Feeding Reference Group (B&IFRG) has launched a community art competition.

This year, World Breastfeeding Week (WBW) is focusing on how breastfeeding contributes to the survival, health and wellbeing of all, and the importance of protecting breastfeeding worldwide.

Artworks must be related to breastfeeding and how it improves the health, development and wellbeing of infants and children as well as mothers, both in the short- and long-term.

The judges will be looking for artwork that:

- Informs people about the importance of protecting breastfeeding
- Represents breastfeeding support as a vital public health responsibility
- Encourages action on protecting breastfeeding to improve public health

Artworks could also show:

- The health benefits of breastfeeding
- The challenges of breastfeeding
- Support for breastfeeding in our community

Artwork format

Entries to the art competition can be created in one of four formats - painting, drawing, photography and digital art, or mixed media. Original artworks and hard copies of photographs are to be submitted (no digital submissions accepted). Please provide signed permission from any person in the photography artwork. Permission forms are available on request.

There is an **artwork size limit of 1 metre in height x 2 metres in width**. Artworks need to be able to be hung on the wall (sculptural works may not be exhibited).

Judging and voting

All artworks will go through a selection process to determine the finalists to be placed on display in the exhibition space in the main corridor, level 4 of Gosford Hospital. The selection panel will include a representative from CCLHD, Gosford Regional Gallery, a community representative and a member of the B&IFRG.

Local representatives from the Australian Breastfeeding Association, Aboriginal community, Central Coast Local Health District and Gosford Regional Gallery will judge the finalists. Competition judging and the announcement of winners will take place during World Breastfeeding Week in August 2021.

Community members will also be given an opportunity to vote for a 'People's Choice Award' from the finalists via a virtual gallery. 'People's Choice' voting will be open from 2nd August to 31st August at:

All entrants will receive a certificate of participation and finalists will be displayed in the main art corridor, level 4 of Gosford Hospital and in a virtual gallery promoted to the community.

Winning entrants will receive a certificate of achievement and given the opportunity for their artwork to be displayed in health services within CCLHD, for community members to appreciate long term.

- b. Finalist selection and judging will be conducted by the Australian Breastfeeding Association, community representatives, Gosford regional Gallery representative, CCLHD staff and the broader community (people's choice). Artworks may be excluded from the final exhibition due to space limitations or otherwise. All decisions are final.
- c. All artists must complete an entry form and attach it to the artwork to be eligible for the competition.
- d. There is a limit of 2 entries per person
- e. The art competition is open to all Central Coast community members and staff.
- f. The artwork entered must be the artist's own work and not breach any intellectual property of any other artist.
- g. Given CCLHD is a public space, artwork considered to have offensive or confronting content will be excluded from display.
- h. The entrant acknowledges and agrees that any artworks and associated stories submitted may be used by the Central Coast Local Health District free of charge to promote its activities associated with this competition and other breastfeeding related health promotion activities.
